**The hotel offers over 14 rooms equipped with every comfort: TV, air conditioning, telephone, safe, and access to the solarium.**

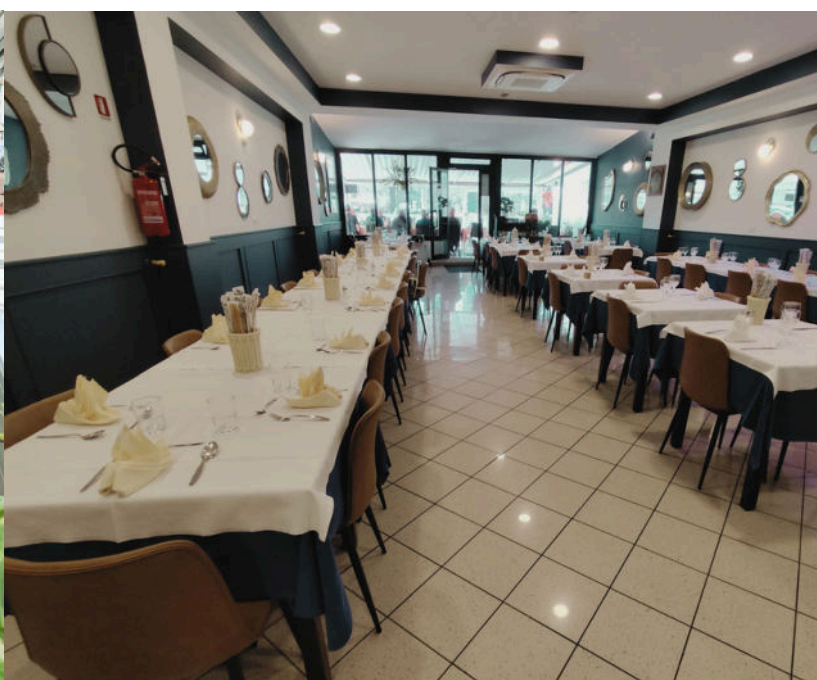

### Historic Centre

Strolling through the carruggi (narrow alleys) of Moneglia feels like stepping back in time: among cobbled lanes and pastel-coloured houses, you'll discover charming glimpses of squares, churches, and hidden corners in a timeless atmosphere.

### Church of San Giorgio

Built in 1396 by Benedictine monks, it features an elegant 15th-century cloister and valuable works of art, including the famous painting Saint George Slaying the Dragon, attributed to Rubens.

### Church of Santa Croce

Erected in 1725 on the remains of an ancient medieval parish, this Ligurian Baroque gem captivates visitors with its rich decorations and timeless charm.

### Villafranca Fortress

Constructed around 1130 as a defensive outpost, today it welcomes visitors with a peaceful Mediterranean garden overlooking the sea—an ideal spot for a scenic break.

### Moneglia Beach

A long stretch of golden sand, nestled between green cliffs and crystal-clear sea. Partly equipped and partly free access, it's perfect for those seeking relaxation or seaside fun.
